Conference of Defence Association Annual Conference and Annual General Meeting

Our media director, Capt Grant Cree attended the CDA annual conference and AGM, held in Ottawa between February 22 and 24, 2018. The following is Grant's report"

On behalf of the Edmonton United Services Institute, I attended the CDA (Conference of Defence Associations) annual conference on 22 – 23 February 2018 at the Chateau Laurier in Ottawa.

The theme was "Canadian Security and Defence in the New World (Dis)Order". This is the largest annual public conference of its kind in Canada to address security and defence policy, military capability, planning and analysis. Over 450 delegates were there, including key decision makers from the Department of National Defence, Canadian Armed Forces, NORAD, the defence and security industry, and academia.

Each guest speaker and panelist delivered their thoughts (some with PowerPoint presentations) on what they perceive as challenges facing our military as Canada adapts to rapid geo-political changes

Around the globe. Some high-profile speakers included Jody Thomas, Deputy Minister of National Defence; General Jonathan Vance, Chief of Defence Staff; and Darrell Bricker with Ipsos.

Providing an international perspective were Major-General Philippe Montocchio of France, Major-General Mitch Mitchell of the UK, and Lieutenant-General (Ret'd) Ben Hodges, former Commander of US Army Forces in Europe. Other speakers included Senator (Ret'd) Romeo Dallaire, Lieutenant-General (Ret'd) Marc Caron, and Rear Admiral Darren Hawco, Chief of Force Development.

There was an enormous amount of insightful and timely information shared during those two days. For those who are interested in current national defence matters, stay tuned for my video presentations featuring several speakers. That way you'll be able to stay aware of what's happening on a strategic level with our military.

For years, the former President, a TBM Avenger torpedo bomber pilot, *thought* he was the youngest Naval Aviator of the war, but Chuck Downey, of Poplar Grove, Illinois, has the President beat by 11 days, a fact the President has since acknowledged.

Downey was born Aug. 2, 1924, in Bridgeport, Connecticut, and commissioned an Ensign in the U.S. Navy on July 16, 1943. He earned his Wings of Gold at the tender age of 18 years, 11 months and 14 days and later flew SB2C Helldiver dive bombers off the carrier U.S.S. Ticonderoga.
